Historic Shell Station - 232 Front Street North

Join us for the next merchant meeting at the historic Shell Station. We will be discussing ideas for a Downtown Merchant Program, review the results from the Downtown Vitality Task Force and upcoming events for 2016. These meetings are casual events and a good way to get to know some of your fellow downtown merchants. We welcome your ideas and appreciate your enthusiasm and support!

At our last meeting we hit on a sweet spot for a meeting time of 8:00 a.m. Attendance included Troy Kline (Troy Hair Salon), Fred Baydass (Chicago Pastrami), Susan Bridges (Yum E Yogurt), Alison Lang (retail Pop Up), Eric Paschal (Levitite), Ann Nguyen (Le Petite Nail), Irene Wickstom (KCLS) and Robb Hunt (Village Theatre). Everyone expressed continued concern about the homeless issue. Susan Bridges with Yum E Yogurt had a naked man run through her store a few weeks ago. Patrols will be stepping up again downtown. The City of Issaquah Police Department has a Paws on Patrol Program that helps prevent crime while you walk your dog. CITY NEWS

The City of Issaquah is planning some long overdue drainage work on Front Street between Alder and Sunset this summer. Work is estimated to commence in July/August with sidewalk work to include widening the sidewalk on the east side of the street, to better match the west side of the street. Following this work, the City will be conducting a paving overlay on Front between Gilman and Sunset in August and September. The City will also be making ADA upgrades to the crosswalks and sidewalk ramps in several places along Front Street.

The older trees on Front between Alder and Sunset have been slated for replacement due to a variety of factors and will be taken out as part of the drainage project. Colorful planters with new plantings will replace them temporarily. Next year, the City of Issaquah and DIA will be working on a Streetscape plan. We will need your input!

The City and DIA will be performing more outreach to businesses and property owners as more information becomes available.
